

**IFAW Hunting Poll**  
**Topline Results – 15/09/09**

- Ipsos MORI interviewed a representative quota sample of 2,003 adults in GB aged 15+.
- Interviews were carried out face-to-face, in home, using CAPI (Computer Aided Personal Interviewing Laptops), as part of the Ipsos MORI Omnibus (Capibus).
- The sample design ensures that the Omnibus accurately reflects the GB population in terms of region and area types as well as respondent demographics. In order to correct for minor deviations, the Omnibus uses a rim weighting system which weights to NRS defined profiles for age, social grade, region and working status - within gender, as well adjustments for the ethnicity, deprivation and rurality profile. All results are weighted.
- Fieldwork was conducted between 4-10 September 2009.
- Results are based on all respondents unless otherwise stated.
- Where results do not sum to 100%, this may be due to multiple responses, computer rounding or the exclusion of don't knows / not stated.
